About Humayun's Tomb Complex

Humayun's Tomb, Delhi is the first of the grand dynastic mausoleums that were to become synonyms of Mughal architecture with the architectural style reaching its zenith 80 years later at the later Taj Mahal. Humayun's Tomb stands within a complex of 27.04 ha. that includes other contemporary, 16th century Mughal garden-tombs such as **Nila Gumbad**, **Isa Khan**, **Bu Halima**, **Afsarwala**, **Barber's Tomb** and the complex where the craftsmen employed for the Building of Humayun's Tomb stayed, the Arab Serai. Humayun's Tomb, also known as the "Dormitory of the Mughal", houses not one or two but 100 tombs inside the single complex.

Contrary to popular belief, Humayun's Tomb was the source of inspiration behind the conception of Taj Mahal. As Humayun's Tomb was built by Hamida Begum in memory of her husband after his demise, Mughal Emperor Shahjahan got inspired to make something grand and monumental after his wife, Mumtaz Mahal's demise.
